Carol S. Tuschhoff, 86 was born Easter Sunday April 4th , 1926 in Woodhull, Illinois during a blizzard. She passed away Monday October 29, 2012 at 12:25 am.

Honoring Carol's wishes: Cremation rites were performed. A private family service will be held at a later date. Until then, she rests on the fireplace mantel in their favorite room.
