Decatur-Frederick H. Hendricks, 84 of Decatur passed away 7:56 am Saturday March 5, 2011 at St. Mary's Hospital.

Services to celebrate Fred's life will be 2:00 pm Thursday, March 10, 2011 at Graceland/Fairlawn Funeral Home with Pastor Darren Morrow officiating. Visitation will be from 1 ' 2:00 pm Thursday at the funeral home. Services will conclude with Military Rites by the Macon County Honor Guard followed with the 'Flight Home' ceremony. Interment will be private in Camp Butler National Cemetery near Springfield, IL. Memorial donations may be made to the Rock Springs Conservation District. Fred was born on May 22, 1926 in Homewood, IL the son of Harold and Ruth (Morgan) Hendricks. Fred proudly served his country in the U.S. Army from 1944 ' 1946. He was a graduate of Millikin University and taught history at the Jr. High School in Niantic for several years. After his retirement Fred busied himself as a volunteer at the Rock Springs Conservation District. He was also an avid Chicago Cub fan. He married Mary Dial in Decatur and they later divorced. Fred married Lavonne Voss in November 1973 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Decatur.
