Joe will be forever remembered and deeply missed.

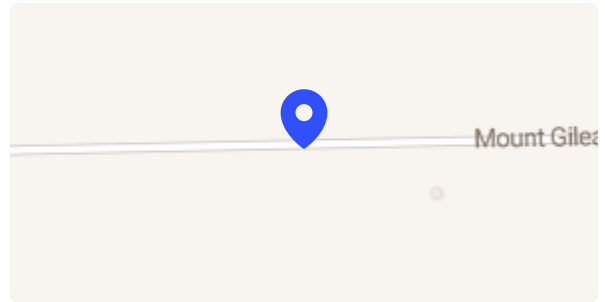
