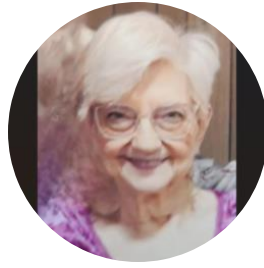

Betty (McPherson) Weger, 83, of Decatur, Illinois, died February 20, 2026, in her home. A graveside service will be held at 11am on Friday, February 27, in Graceland Cemetery with Pastor Brett Hinrichs officiating.

Betty was born in Hillsboro, Illinois on November 14, 1942, the only child of Albert Ross (Mac) and Mary Luthella (Wilhelm) McPherson. Betty was primarily a homemaker but worked several part-time jobs in the service industry and as a volunteer prior to her retirement. Betty enjoyed reading, her dogs, and putting in her flower gardens. She married Darrell “Dean” Weger on March 2, 1968. He preceded her in death on February 26, 2012.

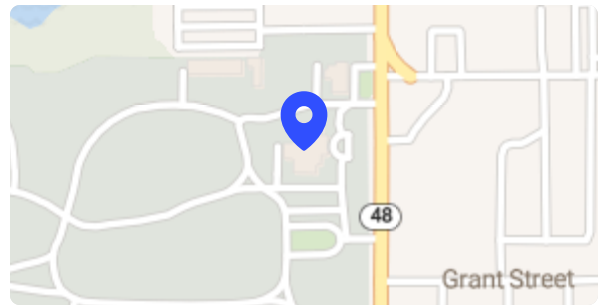

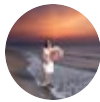

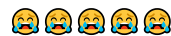
Scott Collins posted:
